Whereas in the past, we could easily organize our own cleanups and other community events and simply request help from the City, we now have to follow a process to be scheduled as part of the City's planned cleanup efforts and schedule. That said, we are making progress and we'll be hosting more events coming up in the next 4-6 months, so stay tuned.


We recently hosted an event at Vista Park as part of the Great American Litter Cleanup sponsored by BeautifySJ and the City of San Jose Parks and Recreation Department. This happened on April 20th at Vista Park. Many thanks to all the volunteers who showed up to help pick up trash and remove graffiti at Vista Park but also in the surrounding streets in the neighborhood. You made a difference! We also have two exciting events planned. First, on August 24th, the VEP, in conjunction with District 2 Leadership, will be hosting a cleanup at Parkview Elementary School as well as Parkview I and Parkview II parks. Captain Stephen Donohue, our SJPD Southern Division police captain, has been working with the SJFD, Parks and Recreation, the principal of Parkview Elementary, the Oak Grove School District Superintendent's office and other key stakeholders to make this event happen. Both the SJFD and SJPD plan to cook breakfast for all of the volunteers, and we'll be heavily recruiting you all to turn out and help. The City will be providing everything we need, including tools, cleaning supplies and logistics support to help us get the job done. Mark this date in your calendars now, we'll be sending out more reminders and a call for volunteers as we get closer to the date.

Second, we have decided that we will be hosting our own National Night Out this year on Tuesday, August 6th. We're still working on the details, more to follow, including the park we will host this at. We are planning for food trucks, music and some activities for the kids. This is a great opportunity to come out and meet your neighbors and support our community.

We canceled our recent meeting in May so that members could attend the Basking Ridge Neighborhood Association's meeting and listen to Mayor Matt Mahan's Budget Message. As expected, the City has had to make some necessary trade-offs this year due to a budget shortfall. The good news is that the budget keeps the City's top priorities in place of sheltering the unhoused, cleaning up the

city and removing blight and increasing the safety and security of our neighborhoods with the recruitment of new police officers. You can learn more here about the Mayor's Budget Message and priorities.

As one example, we are in the process of preparing a list of improvements we want to see in several parks in our neighborhoods such as Meadows Park and Parkview I and II parks which are in bad need of improvements and plan to meet with Parks and Recreation to share our concerns and proposed list of improvements and encourage them to prioritize these improvements.



# CAM Rebate Program

From SJPD Southern Division Captain, Stephen Donohue

I am pleased to share an exciting opportunity provided by our department that is set to benefit your constituents, local small businesses, nonprofit organizations, and places of worship.

In our ongoing efforts to enhance public safety and improve evidence collection, we have secured a \$75,000 grant to subsidize the purchase of external security cameras. Each eligible applicant can receive a rebate for cameras costing up to \$350, including taxes.

We are eager to discuss this program with you individually and provide detailed information. Our team is also prepared to facilitate meetings, application drives, and any other support needed to ensure comprehensive accessibility to this program. We offer these services in English, Spanish, and Vietnamese to accommodate our diverse community.

Please contact Monica Rueda at monica.rueda@sanjoseca.gov to schedule a meeting or have any questions regarding the program.

To participate, applicants must follow these four simple steps:

- 1. Complete a preliminary application and receive conditional acceptance e-mail.
- Note: Purchases made from July 2022 onward are eligible under this retroactive program.
- 2. Buy the camera and submit an itemized receipt.
- 3. Install the camera and submit a photograph of the installed unit.
- 4. Register the camera with our CAM Program.

Upon completion of these steps, we will review the application and documentation. Qualified applicants will be instructed on where to collect their rebate check. Please note, this is a first-come, first-served program, and approval of preliminary applications does not guarantee funding.
